PLAY-YARD RENEWAL PROJECT SPONSORSHIP REQUEST

Woodroffe Avenue Public School

Due to the removal of the play-structure in our primary (grades 1-3) yard in the summer of 2011, we have an <u>urgent need</u> to raise funds to replace the structure and revitalize the entire yard. We aim to fulfill the expressed needs of the students, teachers and parents of the school by creating a playful and safe environment in which an appreciation for nature can be nurtured. An outdoor classroom, more shade, new play equipment, and a garden in the courtyard are a few examples of what we hope to achieve. The entire community stands to benefit, beyond the 470 families that are represented in our school body. Only through the generosity of our families and community can our dreams be accomplished. Please consider supporting this worthy endeavor.

Why the Primary Yard Needs Renewal

The impetus for the renewal of the primary yard at Woodroffe Avenue Public School (WPS) is that the play structure in the primary yard was removed in July 2011. The children are left with three vast areas – grass, sand and pavement – to play without any guidance and encouragement in the environment for different types of play. It has been found that leaving vast open space, that do not encourage various types of play (both active and passive), leads to the need for increased surveillance, conflict and accidents¹.

Project Goals

The primary goal of the Primary Yard and Court Yard Renewal Project is to develop an outdoor environment for the students in Grades 1 to 3 that:

- Encourages physical activity and is a *playful environment* that encourages various different types of play but also provides areas for children who desires more passive and *quiet spaces* for play;
- Is *safe* ensuring current standards are met, and appropriate surfaces are provided for play (e.g. grass area for soccer), and that the design enhances the children's comfort from exposure to the heat and sun;
- Encourages an appreciation for nature through play in the natural environment; and

• Provides teachers with an *area for outdoor learning* (which could be used by the entire school).

The project also aims to develop the area in the courtyard into a safe and comfortable area where children of grades 1 to 6 can mingle and play together.

Survey

In the initial stage of this project, a survey of students, teachers and parents was conducted. The survey results concluded that more shade (in primary yard and courtyard), a play structure, an outdoor classroom and the reclaiming of more green space are desired. From the results it was concluded that the primary yard plan should aim to incorporate the following areas:

- <u>Play structure or play structures</u> (it would be desired to find ways to spread out the structure or have multiple structures to accommodate the size of the student population);
- Shaded area to incorporate outdoor classroom and quiet play;
- Imaginative play areas;
- Larger <u>field for soccer</u> type activities during classroom or recess time;
- Smaller open areas for other active play like tag;
- Sand area (which may be worked into play structure area or other equipment area);
- More inviting use of play pavement area; and
- Enhancing the courtyard with things like <u>benches and/or garden</u>, and providing extra shade in this area.

A diagram of the plan that has been proposed to meet the above criteria is on the last page of this sponsorship request packet.

How the project benefits the community

Woodroffe Avenue Public School is an <u>integral and vital part of serving the needs of families</u> in the McKellar Park, Carlingwood, Woodpark, McKellar Heights, Whitehaven, Britannia and Lincoln Heights communities. <u>470 families</u> are represented in the student body. We believe that by improving the quality of life of each individual student, we improve the quality of life within each family. This indirectly leads to stronger communities and stronger workplaces.

WPS encourages community groups to use their space, in accordance with the Ottawa Carleton District School Board (OCDSB) policy, as stated on their website: "In partnership with the Ministry of Education and Ministry of Tourism and Recreation, we are making school space more affordable and accessible in support of healthy, active lifestyles and helping to build vital communities that offer the residents within the District a higher quality of life." Currently the following community organizations are using the school building and/or grounds: Woodroffe School-Age Program (City of Ottawa), YMCA After School Program, OCDSB International Languages Program, Al-Nour Arabic School, OCDSB Extra-Curricular Arts Program, Learn to Play, Adult Co-Ed Sports League, Ottawa Royals Soccer Club, Adult Volleyball, Lighthouse Volleyball, Girl Guides of Canada, and Day Care summer Program (City of Ottawa).

In addition to providing a stimulating and safe play area for students during the school day, <u>the</u> grounds of the school can be accessed by the public outside of the instructional day, i.e., after school, and when other leased users are not using the space. We <u>anticipate increased usage</u> by members of the community with the development of our proposed plans for renewal.

- Outdoor classroom, with gazebo, bench seating and a stage


